Project Description	<p>Due to flooding in October 2024, the municipality of Kiseljak faced a serious drinking water supply problem in 2025, as the main water intake in the Zeče field area was damaged. The floods caused additional erosion and strain on the already dilapidated infrastructure, as the Fojnica River once again overflowed its banks and flooded the wider catchment area. Of the five existing wells, only two were operational, which meant that the available supply of drinking water was greatly reduced. Even in winter, when consumption is lower, they barely met the basic needs of the population and the economy, so there was a water shortage in the warmer months. This situation posed a serious risk to the health of the population and the smooth operation of businesses, so a complete reconstruction of the water intake was necessary to ensure a stable and safe supply of drinking water.</p> <p>The renovation of the Zeče polje water intake facility ensured a reliable supply of drinking water for approximately 6,500 residents of the municipality of Kiseljak. The project directly improved access to clean drinking water in the following settlements: Dugo Polje, Lug, Gromiljak, Jehovac, Rauševac, Dubrave, Radna zona Dugo Polje, Behrići, Gomionica, and the urban area of Kiseljak, which were dependent on a dilapidated water system that no longer met the basic needs of the population due to damaged wells and the effects of flooding. The project was therefore essential for improving public health, living conditions, and the sustainable development of the local community.</p> <p>CMSR implemented the project in cooperation with Caritas Slovenia, and the project was co-financed by the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Republic of Slovenia.</p>
